REQUIREMENTS (Per EID adopted Administrative Regulation 9024):

- **MINIMUM PARCEL SIZE OF ONE ACRE**
- **MINIMUM ½ ACRE PLANTED AGRICULTURAL CROPS AND/OR QUALIFYING LIVESTOCK AS A MARKETABLE.** *For parcels with 5 acres or more planted in agricultural crops or 10 acres or more of irrigated pasture: AMI Applications must be submitted to the El Dorado Irrigation District (EID)
- **MAINTENANCE OF THE CROP TO PRODUCE A MARKETABLE PRODUCT**

SMALL FARM IRRIGATION RATE APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

1. **TYPE OF CROP OR LIVESTOCK:** List each commodity or livestock type on separate lines.
2. **Size of Crop:** List either the square footage or acreage of each of the planted crop varieties. Livestock requires the number of animals and the square footage or acreage of the irrigated pasture. Note: All livestock operations must follow all County zoning ordinances.
3. **PRODUCING A CROP:** If the crop has been producing in the past or will be producing this coming harvest season, then state "Yes". Production of Christmas trees means that they are mature enough to be harvested. Livestock means that they are raised for breeding and sale, produce a marketable product from the animals (oil, leather, fiber, etc.) or raised to produce a food product.

APPLICATION FEE:

Current Certified Producer Certificate and Small Farm Application: \$50.00 fee
Non-Certified Producer, Small Farm Application only: \$100.00 fee

Application(s) and fees must be submitted in person

Submit application and application fee to the El Dorado County Department of Agriculture, Weights and Measures located at 311 Fair Lane, Placerville, CA 95667

APPLICATION PROCESS:

1. Applicant submits completed application and fee to the El Dorado County Department of Agriculture.
2. A site visit is scheduled to verify the data submitted on the application and to ensure that El Dorado Irrigation District's (EID) criteria for their Small Farms Irrigation Rate is met.
3. If the criteria are met, a Certificate of Compliance will be mailed to the applicant and EID. It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure that EID has received and accepted the Certificate of Compliance.
4. An expiration date is noted on the Certificate of Compliance. For renewal purposes, a new application and fee will need to be submitted. Please retain a copy of your original (or last) application for reference.

Acreage Calculation: [Maximum Allowable Feet² of planting X # of plants] ÷ 43,560 = Total Acre(s)

1 acre = 43,560 sq. ft. 1/2 acre = 21,780 sq. ft. Total is based on combination of all crops, not the size of the parcel.

*The plant numbers listed above are the minimum and some crops may require additional plants in order to meet the minimum 1/2 acre planting requirements.

†The square footage numbers in the maximum allowable square feet column cannot be exceeded.
